Open Shop Schedule – Hugo Privitt

Upcoming Open Shop Activities:

<u>WE WILL HAVE OPEN SHOP ON SEPTEMBER 17th</u>, Following our regular D.A.W. Meeting on Thursday , September 15th! **Volunteer Instructors are needed for - Skew Spindle Turning and Bowl Turning**

Open Shops run from 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. at Wood World.

- 1) Please remember to park in the alley behind the store.
- 2) All stock prep needs to be done previously before coming to Open Shop. *If stock prep is necessary at Wood World, ask Wood World Employees to assist in the use of any Wood World Machinery.
- 3) All members attending Open Shop must adhere to the A.A.W. Safety Rules Guidelines...handouts will be provided at Open Shop. These safety Guidelines include wearing a face shield while turning, (face shields are avaliable for loan or purchase), and wearing leather shoes when working at the Open shop.
- 4) Please check your tool bags and boxes before leaving Open Shop, too insure that all D.A.W. Tools have been returned to the Lathe Tool Box you checked out at the Open Shop. Also, make sure you have all of

your personal tools accounted for.....your personal tools should be marked before bringing them to Open shop.

<u>In September</u> - We will turn bowls again, and practice spindle techniques, (with more emphasis on safely using the SKEW CHISEL). Some Spindle Blanks will be avaliable, but bring some practice wood blanks for bowls and spindle turning.


AnchorSeal
