## **February Training Class for Members**

#### **Piston box**





**Instructor:** Tod Raines

When: Saturday February 4<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am to approximately 1:00 pm

Where: Wood World

Cost: \$25 per person, one spindle blank will be provided

Class size: 6-7 total Class type: beginner

This class will demonstrate and teach how to turn a piston box. Fundamental lathe operation, safety and simple spindle turning techniques will be covered. This project allows for the use of either carbide scraping tools or traditional gouges and tooling. This project makes use of the tail stock for drilling operations for all the hollowing therefore no special hollowing tools or techniques are needed nor covered in this class. There will be some room for some individual design decisions on the style and form of the box. If time allows the student will also create the project jigs – cylinder gauge and sanding spindle. The following lathe tools will be used: spindle roughing gouge, parting tool, square end scraper, skew (optional), spindle gouge (optional), three-point tool (optional), and possibly others. All students are encouraged to bring their own turning tools. The project also requires the use of forstner style drill bits sized at 1&1/8" and also 1&1/4". If students have these two forstner drill bits, please bring them as well.

Students must wear closed-toed shoes and are encouraged to bring their own personal safety gear. Face shields must be worn while turning and the club can provide a face shield if you do not have one.

Signup for this class will start at the January club meeting.

#### **April Training Classes by Alan Lacer**

Alan Lacer to Teach April 21,22,23 and DEMO for the club April 20. Class fee: \$125.



Alan has been involved in the turning field for over 38 years as a turner, teacher, writer, exhibition coordinator, expert witness, demonstrator and past president of the American Association of Woodturners. His work has appeared in a number of regional and national exhibitions. Alan has been a regular instructor and demonstrator of the craft--having worked in all 50 states as well as 5 foreign countries. He has published over 150 articles, columns and tips, covering technical aspects of woodturning, many specific projects, stories related to both contemporary and historical woodturning and the turning traditions of Japan and Germany. He has also produced five videos on his own, with three of them winning a total of five national awards. In 1999 the American Association of Woodturners awarded him their Lifetime Honorary Member Award for his contributions to the field. He has also appeared on national TV woodturning programs on PBS and DIY.

Alan is well known for his ability to make the skew chisel magical and has done several videos on it's use.

#### **Lacer Class Schedule**

#### April 21

Skew 1: A close look at shaping, sharpening and obtaining scary sharp edges on this versatile tool. Alan will also show you how to make the lathe friendly to overcome any fear of the skew. From there will be a look at at least six different cuts with the skew.

#### April 22

Skew 2: A continuation of Skew 1 or for those who already have confidence with the skew. Emphasis will be on developing the rolling and pommel cuts. To apply the information Alan will have participants make three to four projects using only the skew chisel. These will be door stops, eggs, stick pens, spinning tops and tool handle.





April 23

Turned Lidded Boxes: Alan will begin with a number of turned lidded boxes to show the variety of possibilities. From there Alan will discuss wood selection, chucking methods and finishing options. Following that Alan will demonstrate in stage a turned lidded box. Participants will be following along for each step to complete at least one box for the day.



All classes will have a section on sharpening.

## **Empty Bowls and Beads of Courage by Lou Boudreaux**

Seven members donated 24 Empty Bowls at the November DAW meeting. Richard Braddock and Lou Boudreaux were the leading contributors with 7 each. Empty Bowls total for 2016 stands at 202. Twenty-five Beads of Courage boxes were submitted in November, 11 by DAW members and 14 by non-members. Thanks to the Southeastern Oklahoma Woodturners for the 22 boxes from their Masters of Turning event. Contributors to Empty Bowls and Beads of Courage in 2016 are shown in the table below.

Empty Bowls will be held at the Myerson Symphony Center on March 10, 2017, with bowls being due on February 17. 
#### **AnchorSeal**
